CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS

Welcome to the summer edition of the Parish magazine.

As from May 3rd 2019 we now have a new Council and welcome Mrs. Carol Northwood (Stantonbury and Linford Wood), Mrs. Barbara Wright (Oakridge Park) and Mr. Muhammad (Abid) Anwar (Bradville). Regrettably we say goodbye to Cllr Farmer (Oakridge Park) and Cllr Parker (Stantonbury and Linford Wood) and thank them for their work and contributions to the parish. The body of the Council therefore remains largely unchanged. A full list is provided on our website.

In this copy we have taken the opportunity to re-state what a Parish Council can and cannot do. This new Council will serve the community until 2023 and we will be publishing a four-year plan in the near future. An outline of the areas we are considering is also given later in the magazine.

We continue to support the construction of the Aldi store on Stantonbury and the retention of the mural in some form which is presenting some serious challenges. Planning approval for the store has been awarded but with caveats regarding the wall. We will keep parishioners advised through our website how this progresses.

Looking forward we have changed our IT provider and this change will provide direct emails to all councillors. The Parish Ranger phone number will also change. Details will be provided to all residents in due course.

In response to complaints regarding dog fouling, we welcome David Barnes who we have contracted for the purpose of reducing dog fouling and fly tipping throughout the parish. David is a Milton Keynes Council certified Enforcement Officer and can issue on the spot fines for transgressors. To clarify his role slightly, he is not there to pick up dog waste – as has been requested by a dog walker!

Speeding continues to plague the parish and in recent weeks speeds of 50mph were recorded in Ashfield (limit 30mph). The section of road this was recorded on was 150 yards (137m) long, steeply inclined, commencing at a blind corner and finishing at a T junction. In plain terms the vehicles were accelerating downhill in a residential area. The vehicle registrations are recorded.

We are therefore meeting with the Chief Inspector of Thames Valley Police with a view to enforcing speed limits and a campaign on crime prevention generally. The outcome of the meeting with TVP will be uploaded onto our website.

We receive many positive comments regarding the work of the Parish Ranger Lee and we thank the community for these. Employing Lee has been very successful and we are expanding this role by employing a further Ranger initially on a part-time basis, moving to full-time as demand for maintenance issues increases. Alongside Lee we are delighted to have a body of Parish Guardians who regularly provide feedback about the parish and come together to have regular litter picks.

The Parish Council hopes our parishioners have a pleasant summer.

STANTONBURY PARISH COUNCIL FOUR-YEAR PLAN

As stated elsewhere in this quarter's magazine we hold an annual Meet The Councillors Meeting at which parishioners can propose items for the Parish Council to address in the oncoming year.

For the next four years of this Council we have prepared a Four-Year Plan considering the potential change in services provided by Milton Keynes Council, the demographic changes in our population and structuring our control of the activities of the Parish Council for beyond 2023. Notwithstanding this Plan, parishioners can make requests for the Parish Council to consider other matters at the Meet the Councillors Meetings.

In the Plan we aim to address the following:-

- 1. Better demographic representation. (More Councillors per 1000 of the population).
- 2. To improve efficiency and related cost saving in the administration of the parish office. (Achieve quality mark status).

- 3. To provide fiscal long-term stability. (Funding to enable continued expansion of infrastructure maintenance).
- 4. To have a process of continuous interaction with parishioners. (Events, community bus, Wi-Fi, e-newsletter, recognition of the population ages and so on).
- 5. To adopt and enhance devolved services from Milton Keynes Council (as and when offered).
- 6. To add services which benefit the parish community. (Take on those items we see will benefit greater input than that provided by Milton Keynes Council, provide a community bus etc.).
- Speeding/Parking/Crime reduction. (To reduce offences in these issues significantly).
- 8. To introduce a sustainability policy for the parish. (Recycling bins, electric charging points) by working closer with adjoining parishes to reduce costs.

OUR PARISH COUNCIL

Stantonbury was built on the premise of a better quality of life and in its early days there was a five-year waiting list to move into the area. Many of our parishioners can remember a gentler pace of life and the Parish Council comprised a few like-minded people meeting at the Campus.

Today we live in a world driven by technology and heightened social awareness. With this technological progress a greater "press of life" has evolved, fuelled by a culture of electronic social interaction and instantaneous communication. Demands on individuals are far greater now than ever before and increase almost daily with the rapid pace at which technology evolves.

A Parish Council may therefore appear outmoded in this modern society compared to the daily issues broadcast so rapidly. The Parish Council is the first level of local government enshrined in legislation set down by Parliament in 1957 and 1972. Not many parishioners can say what a Parish Council does and we are often confused with the role of the Borough Council. A great many just see it as an additional cost of no benefit.

However, being the first level, and therefore the closest body of government representation in touch with the population, we try to make sure, as parishioners ourselves, our voices are heard at higher levels. We are independent and do not have political allegiance to any party. We are here to listen to your comments and act wherever possible. Annually at the Meet the Councillors Meeting the parishioners have the right to tell the Council which three things they would like to be addressed in the oncoming year.

This year's targets being considered are:-

- Request by parishioners to provide high visibility vests to the Parish Guardians.
- 2. Requested by the Police to provide, if possible, a mobile screen for graffiti artists.
- 3. To consider funding to promote the parish in the Britain in Bloom competition.

The following is an extract from a full list of Parish Council duties within the parish, showing what we can provide. What has been omitted is being provided by Milton Keynes Council or not at all:-

- · Allotments
- · By-laws the power to make by-laws concerning: baths and washhouses (swimming pools), cycle paths, mortuaries and pleasure grounds
- · Entertainment and the Arts
- \cdot Footpaths
- General Spending parish councils can spend a limited amount of money on anything they deem of benefit to the

- community that is not covered by the other specific responsibilities described in this list
- · Legal proceedings power to prosecute and defend any legal proceedings in the interests of the community, power to take part in any public enquiry
- · Litter provision of litter-bins and support for any anti-litter campaigns
- Planning parish councils may be notified of any planning applications for the area
- · Rights of Way footpath and bridleway maintenance
- · Seats (public)
- · Signs danger signs, place names and bus stops signs
- · Traffic calming
- · Grants to community-based groups

In addition to the above we are also providing maintenance of certain aspects of the green spaces and footpaths in preparation of the end of the Serco contract at which time we will apply to take over all the parish landscape maintenance.

PARISH RANGER UPDATE



The last three months of this year have been a very busy time for me. The recent litter picks around the parish yielded lots of sacks of rubbish and at one stage the three doors on the van were at bursting point.

My thanks to those Parish Guardians who have helped me over the last few months. More litter picks will be taking place soon. Fly-tipping around the estates remains a big issue, which we have mentioned elsewhere in the Newsletter.



New Skate Park Adventure Playground (see p.13)

MKC have cleared the way for the lorries to access the park situated in Stantonbury. MKC have removed the redway bollards near to the bus stop on Spencer and have opened the area to the right of the park and removed a soil mound within the park in preparation for the work to start. Bendcrete have also asked for the trees along the redway to be lifted in order for the lorries and plant equipment to travel safely along and not cause damage to other vehicles or trees.

Pocket Play Parks

The Ranger has been working closely with MKC and they have been looking at which of our play park equipment needs attention. The plan is for MKC to make safe and repair damaged play equipment and to remove any dangerous equipment. This is an ongoing project and once MKC inform us which parks are going to receive attention, we can then ask our Parish Guardians, who have kindly agreed to help tidy the area and give the equipment a fresh coat of paint.



Allotments

The wall of tyres that contain the wood chippings at the allotments have been overhauled and cleaned up. The tyres have all been filled with soil as requested. Two allotment tenants helped our Ranger to clear and restack the tyres.

Things you can do to help the parish in 2019

Household rubbish should be placed on the front boundary of your property. The refuse collection team will collect from this point. Please put your rubbish out after 5pm the day before or before 7am on the day of collection. If you have bulky waste, sofas, fridges, beds and any other large items that you cannot take to the local recycling centres please report it to Milton Keynes Council for them to collect by going on line: https://mycouncil.milton-keynes.gov.uk

Or what about asking your neighbours or friends if they wouldn't mind helping you take large items to the tips? You could join the litter picking group Action 4 Our Communities or contact the office to carry out a couple of hours litter picking around where you live with Stantonbury Parish Council. Contact us if you have a group of neighbours/friends that would like to get out and do something about the litter.

We can supply litter picker tools and bags so please contact Stantonbury Parish Office to arrange on 01908 227201. We want to work for you and with you, to improve the areas where you live.

Help keep footpaths open by trimming back your hedges where pedestrians walk, placing the cuttings in the green wheelie bin. If you don't have one, they can be ordered from MK Council's website and will be delivered to you for free.

Place all used glass bottles and jars in your recycling blue box. Again if you don't have one these can be ordered from the MK Council website and will be delivered to you for free.

These are a few examples of how, you as residents, can help to improve the areas where we all live.

Littering

To encourage residents not to litter


