#### **CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS**

It has been a challenging year since the last Christmas edition of the Parish Newsletter.

We have continued to support the Citizen's Advice unit based in the Parish Office and this has actively been used by residents throughout the year.

Milton Keynes Council has yet to put forward an acceptable plan to the Parish for the devolution of the services that we would want to take over. However, we are seeing reductions in the services they provide. To counter some of this we have introduced a Parish Ranger with responsibility to maintain some of our landscaping and infrastructure.

Throughout the summer we ran our usual coach trips which once again were heavily subscribed to and very successful. Our MK50 celebration in support of Willen Hospice raised just over £1600 and was very well attended and enjoyed by residents. This was the first year we provided free rides to children and this was welcomed by many of the parents. Likewise, the Roman Park fireworks, partially subsidised by the Parish Council was also a success.

2018 is an important year for the Parish Council and residents as we approach our referendum for the Neighbourhood Plan. In January, we will publish the complete draft plan for further public comment

after which it will pass to the Planning Inspectorate for approval and finally our referendum in November.

So we look forward to a busy new year!!

On behalf of the Parish Council and its staff we would like to wish you a happy Christmas and prosperous new year.

# Football skills at Cawarden, Stantonbury (Blue Park)

On Tuesday 1st August, Stantonbury Parish Council held their first of four football skills sessions. The two trained lads had 11 young people (4–8 years) and about 20 teenagers (10–14 years) participating in the different training skills. They all seemed to be having a wonderful time and also a lot of children using the other play equipment within the Park.

On Tuesday 8th August, it was pouring down with rain. Yet three hardy young 4 and 5 year olds really enthusiastically did ¾ of an hours training. The trainers waited around for a further ½ hour but no older children appeared.

On Tuesday 15th August and 22nd August about 30 children came out and enjoyed the fine weather, the football training and a game of football. In between their sessions they had bottled water provided by the Parish Office.

We hope to arrange the ever popular Football Sessions for Wednesday 28th March 2018 and Wednesday 4th April 2018 during the Easter 2018 school holidays at Cawarden, Stantonbury from 1.00 to 3.30pm.

### **FAMILY PLAY SESSIONS IN THE PARK**

As in previous years Stantonbury Parish Council have funded Play Sessions in the local parks during the Summer holidays.

Milton Keynes Play Association supplied their bouncy slide, which has always been popular with the children, along with the cricket sessions and the craft activities. This year there were activities which even appealed to the teenage group.

As an added attraction the Parish Council invited 'The Great Gappo' to come with his circus skills which included juggling and balancing activities. This proved to be very popular with the children (and some of the adults who joined in) to test their talents throughout the afternoon events. This event for the children is totally free and it is hoped to be repeated again next year. The fine weather also encouraged families to make an afternoon of it and bring their picnics with them.

During the month of August the Parish Council organised football sessions at Cawarden Park on Stantonbury for children of all ages, using the services of professional coaches. This was well supported at all age levels and we hope the children had a memorable time. The Parish Council believe in using our park areas to promote the fitness of the younger generation in our Parish. With this in mind it was disappointing to see the lack of support for the two half-term sessions in October. The weather was mild but the opportunity to make use of the FREE coaching was taken up by only very few. 



It has been an extremely busy period for the Neighbourhood Plan Committee as we have moved into the phase for writing the first draft policies which will define the Plan – more about that below!

# STAND AT MK50 EVENT AUGUST 2017

It was fantastic to see so many people attend the MK50 event and especially for the many people who took the time to come and talk to us at our stand.

This was the first opportunity for us to display the maps of each of the estates within the parish, highlighting potential issues, policy areas and specific sites identified from the results of the residents' survey from earlier this year.

We had some really positive feedback and support for the principles of the Plan, along with some interesting and useful discussions about specific issues and policies. More than 40 individuals took the time to complete a short questionnaire on the proposals for the Plan, which have all fed into the process of drafting the policies.

# NORTH BRADVILLE RESIDENT ENGAGEMENT

The Plan Committee recognised the importance of ensuring that residents living in the area of Bradville North, identified for regeneration by Milton Keynes Council, are able to give their views on how the Plan can include a policy in relation to this area.

Two events were held specifically for Bradville North residents in September. A short presentation explained that whilst the Plan itself cannot decide if the regeneration area will be refurbished or redeveloped, it can set out the principles by which those decisions are implemented, whilst also planning for the future of the rest of the Parish that won't be directly affected.

#### **DRAFT PLAN POLICIES**

The policies in the Plan include "General Policies" which apply across the whole of the Parish and

- Open Space & Leisure

- Housing Infill

- Wylie / Harrowden

- Linford Wood Employment Land
- Stanton School
- Stantonbury Community Facility

You can still view the maps relating to these policies by popping into the Parish Council offices during normal opening hours of 9.00am-4.00pm.

We are currently meeting with landowners,

organisations and businesses who have an interest in the above areas/policies to further shape the details, aims and intentions of the policies.

#### WHAT'S NEXT?

We aim to have the draft Plan available for a full resident consultation in early 2018. At this point we will write once more to every household with details of drop-in events where you can view details and discuss the policies with staff and councillors, along with other opportunities to comment on the Plan online or in writing.

As part of our move toward embracing some of the MK Council's devolved services we have appointed a Parish Ranger and we would like to introduce him - Mr Lee Shuttleworth.

# MILTON KEYNES YOUTH CHOIR: REFLECTIONS AND LOOKING FORWARDS TO A BUSY TERM (AND YEAR) AHEAD!



The last term of 2016/17 was a memorable one for the Milton Keynes Youth Choir. We performed in a joint concert with Polymnia (MK's leading chamber choir) in May. The programme contained a terrific range of music, all of which was performed to a very high standard. It was a great experience for our singers to listen to (as well as sing with) such a fine adult choir.

We also had an informal concert, during our rehearsal time at the end of term, at which we said goodbye to some of our singers who are moving on. We used the opportunity to say a huge thank you to a couple of the parents of former members who have filled significant roles for many years, particularly to Karen Elliott who was chair of the choir for 16 years, without whom the choir may not have been able to continue to reach its 21st birthday!

This year will be the 21st for the choir and we are planning a big celebration in July 2018. We hope to be able to gather together many former members, so if you know of anyone who has been involved with the choir, or you have been yourself, then please do get in touch (email address and phone number on the website: mkyc.org.uk).

Before that we have a busy autumn term with two definite performances and another possible. In November, we will be joining the MK Hub group in a trip to the Scratch Youth Messiah at the Royal Albert Hall. This will be a very different experience for the choir: singing with so many others in a huge space –

and how exciting to sing at the Royal Albert Hall! We are also looking forwards to singing with other young people from Milton Keynes.

On 9th December, we will be holding our annual Christmas concert at the church of St Mary and St Giles, Stony Stratford. We are hoping to be joined by other singers to perform parts of the Messiah as well as our usual mix of Jazz, Pop, Classical and World music.

There is also the possibility of a performance in a new commission, celebrating MK's 50th, by our inspirational music director Craig McLeish, although a date and venue has not yet been identified.

The chance to perform music composed, or arranged, by Craig is a terrific bonus for the choir. Those of you who have experienced Young Voices will know about his skill in arranging for and enthusing singers (of all ages!). We recently had the inaugural meeting of our music committee (composed of Craig and a few singers and parents) and it was great to see how the ideas sparked and were developed into plans for new pieces and arrangements.

We have welcomed quite a few new, and excellent, singers to the choir recently, but we have capacity to take more. We think it's going to be a very exciting year!

#### MORIBAYASSA AFRICAN DRUMMING

Moribayassa African Drumming Community Group have been based at Stantonbury for over 13 years now, run by a committee of unpaid volunteers. We learn traditional African Rhythms on Traditional African drums and perform at local community and charity events.

In 2017 Moribayassa Drummers performed in the MK Festival of Arts in March winning Silver in the E2 class improving on their previous year's Bronze. In May Moribayassa Drummers performed at the Community Foundation Voluntary and Community Sector Reception. June saw the group at the Festival of Giants performing in Campbell Park. Some members from Moribayassa were also honoured to perform with Nkiru Arts drummers at Inspire Watford's Arts Festival, the visit of HRH the Duke of Cambridge in September and Northampton's Diwali Lantern Parade. The year will end with African Drummers at the Stony Lights Parade.

We are always open to new members. The beauty of African Drumming is that it is great fun and no previous musical knowledge is needed. Beginner classes are run by Nkiru Arts on a Wednesday evening. Once the basics have been learned, drummers feed

#### PARISH COUNCIL SUPPORTS LOCAL FOOD BANK

We were delighted to receive a donation of £1000 from the parish council in 2016 which we have used to provide emergency food parcels to residents living within the Stantonbury parish during 2016/17. It is generous donations such as these that help to ensure that no adult or child in Milton Keynes should go to bed hungry.

The Food Bank operates from a warehouse in Stacey Bushes where a team of 4 paid staff and 70 volunteers ensure that food is collected, sorted and distributed to 12 serving centres across Milton Keynes on a weekly basis. In recognition of the invaluable support we receive from our volunteers we were proud to have been awarded the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service 2017.

Having enough food to provide for your family and yourself is a basic need that the Food Bank is here to support. Getting enough to eat can make all the difference for those coping with times of difficulty or crisis. One of the new initiatives we have been proud to be involved in this year is the Oneinflve MK project. This provides lunch packs to children during school

holiday periods that would otherwise have been in receipt of free school lunches. From an initial trial in February half term, the project was successfully rolled out to the school summer holidays', providing over 1600 lunch packs over a 6 week period.

As Christmas approaches we have been busy with our Christmas hamper programme. We have worked closely with local agencies, including the Squirrels Centre to request nominations for families in your parish who would benefit from this additional support at Christmas. We are most grateful to the local community, our business partners and network of supporters who have worked tirelessly to ensure that these hampers are made available to those most in need at this time of year.

#### THE TRUE COST OF LITTER

As we approach the Xmas Holidays, The Parks Trust has calculated the true cost of dropping litter in the city's many parks, woodlands and lakes. Litter is a major issue for The Parks Trust, which manages and maintains over 6,000 acres of green space in Milton Keynes. The self-financing charity can reveal that:

- During one week of the 2016 summer holidays, the Trust collected 848 bags of litter across its parks – this equates to 4.24 tonnes of rubbish in just one week
- The Parks Trust's litter costs have escalated by £100,000 over the last three years and now stand at over £330,000 (exc. VAT) each year
- Over 15% of the Trust's operations budget is now spent on cleansing of litter
- There have been 14 incidents since 2015 where litter-dropping offenders have been identified and spot fines administered or prosecutions sought
- The amount of litter picked up by the Trust's rangers and volunteers increased by 35% last year
- In one day earlier this year, a group of corporate volunteers collected 82kg of rubbish around the Floodplain Forest Nature Reserve

Rob Riekie, Landscape and Operations Director, for The Parks Trust, commented: "As you can see a dropped crisp packet here or a drinks bottle there adds up, and really does have a huge impact on the parks – both in terms of how they look to other users and how much we can spend on managing and improving them.

What people often forget is that we are a self-financing charity not funded by the council tax or government. Every penny we spend has to be found from the money we earn from our activities and from our investments. The money we spend on clearing litter could be used for things such as more play areas and facilities in the parks or more free events or more Community Rangers to patrol the green space. We would like to thank all those who do clear up after themselves, and encourage the small minority who don't to really think about the impact their actions have. We ask that people take their litter home with them and dispose of it there, as this really helps to minimise the money we spend on collecting and removing rubbish.

Patients registered also have access to appointments at other surgeries in the evenings and at weekends. We would like to take this opportunity to advise patients for minor problems please use your local Pharmacists.

We have been looking at ways to improve patient

access; following a review of our appointment system, we have implemented a new GP telephone triage system. If you have a medical emergency and are unable to get a face to face appointment you will be offered a telephone triage appointment and if clinically indicated you will then be offered a face to face appointment.

We still have a problem with patients booking appointments and then failing to attend which prevents patients with clinical needs being seen.
