Chair's Welcome

Welcome to the Autumn/Winter edition of our Parish Newsletter. Welcome to all new residents who have recently moved into the Linford Wood area. I hope you find this newsletter informative.

September has been a very sad month with the passing of our well-loved Monarch, Queen Elizabeth ll. Our condolences go to her family as well as our best wishes to our new King Charles Ill.

Many of you may be aware that I was elected Chair of Stantonbury Parish Council in May of 2022. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Cllr Graham Davison for all his hard work over the past 7 years as Chair of the Parish Council. In that period he managed the growth of the parish and the implementation of the Neighbourhood Plan (along with the steering group). The Neighbourhood Plan directs the way forward for such areas of future planning, education, landscaping and commercial activities which are important areas for our residents and their needs.

I am pleased to announce that our staff member Donna Moore has been appointed to the role of Proper Officer and is currently working towards her CiLCA Qualification.

In early September, after months of waiting, we completed the legal transfer of Bradville Hall to SPC from Milton Keynes City Council, now renamed as The Community Hub. We are hopeful that some of the alterations will be completed to the Hub by the end of September, and we will then be able to start activities again for the local community and the Parish. We are intending to run activities for all ages. So please keep an eye on our social media for the latest development.

As promised in our previous newsletter we will be sending out in both the parish e-newsletter and inside this newsletter a survey about what you, the residents, would like to see SPC do for the community in the year 2023/24. Your views are very important to us and will help inform the setting of the parish budget for next year, so please do respond to this survey.

We still have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor in Bradville and one in Oakridge Park. If you would like further information, please see the article on page 5 of this newsletter or contact the parish office. We have now received the yearly update from Crimewave UK, the company who operates our CCTVs around the Parish.

I am pleased to report that numerous fixed penalty notices have now been issued by the Environmental Crime Unit at Milton Keynes City Council for littering offences within the parish and antisocial and drug related offences have been passed to Thames Valley Police.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you and your family all the very best for Christmas and the New Year.

Cllr Judy Kite - my first year Bancroft Councillor

When I retired and ceased my daily commute into London, my thoughts turned to more local activities where I might usefully spend my time.

Following a lengthy walking holiday to celebrate our 'freedom', my husband and I threw ourselves into new roles, his within the education sector he had always worked in, and mine undertaking admin roles for the Citizens Advice Bureau. I followed a couple of years of this with volunteering on the reception desk at Milton Keynes Hospital, pointing people in, hopefully, the right direction down the labyrinth of corridors.

My application to join Stantonbury Parish Council was almost by chance. On a visit to the Parish Office I saw details of a vacancy for the Bancroft ward on their notice board and the thought process began.....

Having been co-opted onto the Council, my first few months were a major learning curve which I tackled by turning up to every meeting possible and listening, absorbing as much as I could. I soon realised the activities of the council were far more wide ranging than I had previously thought.

Since then I have been involved in activities as diverse as litter

picking with the Parish Rangers, the acquisition of a defibrillator requested by a Bancroft resident and soon to be sited at the Meeting Place and hugely successful skip amnesties all around the Parish as a local amenity and to discourage fly tipping. I and other Councillors and staff accompanied a very well attended (3 coaches and a double decker bus) day trip to Clacton with a further trip planned to the Houses of Parliament.



The latest big project is the refurbishment of the Community Hub on Mercers Drive (formerly Bradville Hall) which has been recently acquired as an asset transfer from Milton Keynes City Council. It's a case of 'all hands on board' to get it ready for a myriad of uses, a Community Hub for the whole community.

Following this glorious summer, Councillors' thoughts are now turning ahead to the coming winter months and the needs of the residents of Stantonbury Parish.

Being a Parish Councillor is always interesting and always varied.

SPC Environmental and Enforcement Officer

Hi - My name is David Barnes and I currently work for Stantonbury Parish Council as their Environmental Enforcement Officer dealing with such issues as fly tipping, dog fouling, littering, household waste issues and abandoned vehicles.

I work closely with the Environmental Crime Unit at Milton Keynes City Council to address the above issues in the parish. There are currently several cases under investigation with a view to prosecuting offenders and issuing a fixed penalty fine.

I've chatted with residents regarding waste issues such as the correct day for waste collection and the correct items to go in the clear recycling sacks. Just a reminder that only household waste should be presented for collection after 5pm the day before and before 7am on the day of collection.

Please don't put bulky items out on bin day as these should be disposed of correctly either at the waste recycling centres or by a paid collection. If you are paying a private company for disposal of your waste, please ensure they are licensed waste carriers and always obtain a receipt.

I would like to thank all those residents who take the time to care for our environment making Stantonbury Parish area a great place

What is a Parish Council?

Stantonbury Parish Council is the first tier of Local Government and is closest to the community it serves. It can take decisions and spend money on matters that make a real difference to the residents.

What does Stantonbury Parish Council do?

It represents Stantonbury, Bancroft, Bancroft Park, Bluebridge, Bradville, Oakridge Park and Linford Wood and tries to improve the quality of life in the Parish. It provides services to meet local needs such as allotments, coach trips, support to reduce crime, grants to local organisations.

What are Parish Councillors?

They are democratically elected councillors who work hard to represent and engage with their local community. Stantonbury Parish Council is made up of 13 councillors who hold office for a 4 year term. The 4 year term for our current councillors will end in May 2023. To become a councillor you must meet the eligibility criteria, and follow the 7 principles of public life. You must be able to attend council meetings on the third Wednesday of the month.

Interested in becoming a Parish Councillor? If so, please

- Check out the website of the Electoral Commission which explains the Parish Council Election Process for England including the need to be nominated by two electors. The forms will need to be completed and submitted to www.electoralcommission.org.uk
- Contact the Parish Council and express a interest
- Keep an eye out for vacancies on the Parish Council website, noticeboards, newsletters, and social media

PARISH RANGER REPORT Let's put the pride back into our streets!

Household waste, please make sure that your rubbish bags are put out at the correct time and please clean up any spillages.

- Put your rubbish on the front boundary of your property and the refuse collection team will collect from there.
- Remember to put your rubbish out after 5pm the day before and 7am the day of collection.
- If your bag splits, please re-bag it to prevent rubbish spreading around the street.
- All cardboard boxes should be broken down and placed into recycling sacks.



- Place all used glass bottles and jars into your blue boxes. If you do not have one you can order from MK Councils' website and it will be delivered to you for free:

Fly tipping is an issue throughout the Parish and we have located CCTV cameras in hot spot areas where fly tipping is taking place. The evidence gained by these CCTVs is then sent to the Enforcement Team at MKC. Fines are then issued to the offenders.

Below are just a few examples of the many footpaths where we have cleared and cut back the bushes to make the pathways more accessible.



Nitrous Oxide Canisters

We have noticed an increase in the parish of discarded cannisters.

There is no safe level of drug use.

Effects of nitrous oxide and long-term effects

- incontinence
- numbness in the hands or feet
- · limb spasms
- potential birth defects
- (if consumed during pregnancy)
- weakened immune system
- disruption to reproductive systems
- depression
- psychological dependence
- psychosis
- vitamin B12 depletion (long-term depletion causes brain and nerve damage)
- ringing or buzzing in the ears

Within the Milton Keynes area our local activities are delivered by a fantastic network of volunteers and include social clubs, befriending services, a pub lunch club, a reading group, an arts & crafts group, Tai Chi, walking groups, a tandem group, and a Resource Centre.

Volunteers are a crucial part of our work, we rely on them to help our members access all our services. We are particularly looking for **Volunteer Drivers** who pick up our members from their home and drive them to their local activity or social club, where they can continue to enjoy their hobbies and interests. When you drive for us, you provide the reassurance that a person with sight loss can get safely from A to B, which is a right not a privilege, ensuring that people are able to participate in leisure and social life.

You don't need any experience to volunteer with us, to be a driver you just need your own car, a clean driving licence, and enthusiasm to get involved! We have a range of training opportunities, including your Induction where you'll learn the practical parts of your role and how to confidently guide blind and partially sighted people.

We encourage local groups and businesses within the parish to advertise in this newsletter free of charge Mind BLMK has been supporting people with mental health problems for over 40 years. During this period, the organisation has grown from some small befriending groups to a range of information across Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes.

1 in 4 people will experience a mental health issue each year, whilst 1 in 6 people report experiencing a common mental health problem (such as anxiety and depression) in any given week. Mental health is something we all have and Mind BLMK aim to ensure that everyone can get support when they need it

We currently support over 4,000 people each year. Our services include community-based peer support groups, crisis support, activity and wellbeing groups, workshops, training and 1:1 mentoring.

Mind BLMK is an independent local charity, which relies upon the support of our community and is managed and governed by local trustees.

We are also part of the Mind national network. This gives us the benefits of being part of a national network, sharing knowledge and skills, whilst retaining the local focus and working directly with and for the people of Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes.

Message in a Bottle

What is it?

A little plastic bottle containing a form showing all of your personal details and medications that may be needed by emergency services if you are unable to tell them.

Where do I keep it?

At home, in the fridge. Why? The fridge is easy to find – It's in the kitchen and the design of most fridges keeps the contents safe from fire.

How will the ambulance crew know I have one?

Each bottle comes with a sticker to go inside your front door. It's inside so we don't reveal to the world that a vulnerable person lives here.

Where can I get one?

Bottles are distributed free of charge across the country by Lions Clubs International through your local Lions Club. Credit card sized forms which will fit into a wallet are also available. **Please contact the Parish Office if you would like one for a friend or a vulnerable person you know.**



Bancroft Park Petanque Club Autumn Newsletter 2022



Where has 2022 gone? It seems only a short while since we were slapping on sun cream and trying at the same time to stay cool in the blistering heat.

Fortunately we have plenty of trees at Bancroft to give us good shade whilst we are playing Petanque, but on one occasion we had to cancel a Club competition event due to a forecasted temperature of 35 degrees, just a little too much too much for even our hardiest devotees!

This June we celebrated the Club's 21st anniversary with an evening game followed by a get together of Members with our Guest of Honour, Eric Brown, the Club 'Father' and Founder. On moving to MK, Eric, a keen petanque player could not find anywhere to play locally. So he set about trying to identify a suitable location for a piste and approached the Parks Trust about a site close to where he lived in Bancroft and after just over two years of discussions and lobbying with the support of a number of other enthusiasts he achieved his dream – The Parks Trust Petanque Piste at Bancroft Park was opened, and the Bancroft Park Petanque Club was born. The Parks Trust, with whom we have a great working relationship, this year installed two new benches and replaced the two old existing ones, in addition to maintaining the piste (playing area) infrastructure, and landscape. So a big thank you to them for the provision of a quiet, relaxing and excellent facility for all to enjoy.


