# **Chair's Welcome**

Welcome to the Spring Edition of our Parish Newsletter. I hope you find it informative and entertaining.

I am pleased to announce that Donna Moore has achieved her Certificate in Local Council Administration Qualification and has been appointed to the role of Clerk. A qualified Clerk can lead to a boost in confidence and competence within the Parish. The qualification is vital criteria for a Council wishing to achieve the Local Council Award Scheme status and for the Council to claim General Power of Competence.

Alongside Donna's achievement, we have to announce the fantastic achievements of 3 other members of staff. Sarah Espey, Responsible Financial Officer (RFO), was one of the first RFO's to be awarded the newly created Financial Introduction to Local Council Administration (FILCA). A FilCA qualified RFO has the knowledge to guide Council towards beneficial practices and sources of funding and shows the commitment of the Parish Council towards gaining the Quality

Mark. Kerry Fane (Senior Administrator), and Jess Hardy (Document Controller) our newest recruit, have both achieved their introduction to Local Council Administration (ILCA) qualifications. This helps them have an understanding of Parish Council practices and also helps them guide Council whilst supporting the Clerk in her duties.

I am extremely proud of all the staff and their achievements.

Many changes have happened in the Parish in the past few months. We now have 12 Parish Councillors all working hard to bring positive changes to the Parish and our residents.

On Thursday 4th May 2023, elections for all Councillors will take place alongside new rules on how to vote. We have included a full article in this Newsletter so you can read about the new way to vote on page 7.

After long deliberation, Council voted not to go ahead with Devolved Services at this time. It was felt we would not have sufficient infrastructure in place or provide the levels of service required before the due date. We will however continue to monitor the situation and keep our residents updated. The view not to go ahead at this time was one held not just by us but many other parishes and town councils.

Another date for your diary is Sunday 7th May 2023. We will be holding a party to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III between 11am and 3pm at the Community Hub in Mercers Drive, Bradville, MK13 7AY. It's a free event with plenty for children to do and tea and cake. Please keep an eye out for notices on social media and on our noticeboards. We look forward to seeing you at the celebration.

**Roman Park Residents Club** – received funding for their annual fireworks display last November



# **Budget 2023/24**



In January, Stantonbury Parish Council set the budget and precept for the financial year 2023/24 following a stringent budget setting process.

**Council Tax Figure** - The band D equivalent will increase marginally by £3.03 from £138.11 to £141.14 which equates to a modest rise of less than 6p per week per household.

This 2.19% increase for 2023/24 is significantly lower than the previous year of 7.54%.

**Council Tax Base** - The number of band D equivalent properties has risen to 3264.47 from 3200.40, which is an increase of 64.07, principally due to additional commercial properties in Linford Wood being converted into residential apartments.

The cost-of-living crisis and the need to save is affecting everyone, including local government organisations. In order to ensure financial sustainability and resilience, the budget for 2023/24 focuses on a mixture of savings and use of reserves. There are unavoidable increases within the budget due to the impact of extremely high and rapid

inflation, increased energy costs and salaries.

The total budget for 2023/24 will stand at £680,650. The Parish Council is committing to use a significant contribution of £185,602 from the reserves so that the precept increase has been minimal and well below inflation.

From September to December 2022, we conducted a resident's survey, and your feedback assisted the budget setting process helping us to prioritise the services and events that were most valued by our residents.

The Parish Council has taken great care to ensure the continuation of important existing services such as the running of the allotments, emptying of dog waste bins, enforcement services supporting our parish rangers, closed circuit cameras, litter picking events, regular newsletters, and the well-received rubbish amnesty. We have added a much-needed food bank provision which will open at some point during the year and our Community Hub will be a focal point for everyone to get together throughout the year with a range of activities and events for all ages.



# **How to become a Parish Councillor**

#### **THURSDAY 4TH MAY 2023**

All 13 of Stantonbury Parish Council's Councillor spaces are up for re-election. This is a chance for our current councillors to get nominations if they wish to re-stand. It is also an opportunity for residents to stand as a candidates provided they qualify!

#### WHAT IS A PARISH COUNCIL?

We work to promote community values, help look after the neighbourhood environment and build partnerships with other agencies to solve problems and improve the community for all.

#### YOUR ROLE AS A PARISH COUNCILLOR

YOUR ROLE WILL VARY DEPENDING ON YOUR ASPIRATIONS & AVAILABILITY; THE ROLE CONSISTS OF:

- Attending Full Council meetings once a month, (these are held at 7pm on the 3rd Wednesday of every month).
- Join a variety of committees such as: Finance, HR, Allotments & Community Projects.
- Challenging policies that affect our residents.
- · Balancing needs with financial limits.
- Helping to contribute and vote on decisions that improve the parish and support residents.

#### **DO YOU QUALIFY?**

- 1. Be at least 18 years old.
- 2. Be a British citizen, eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the European Union
- 3. Meet at least one of the following criteria:
  - A) You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards.
  - B) You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.
  - C) Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish area.
  - D) You have lived in the parish area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

# New Regulations for Voting at the May Elections

For the first time, electors in England will need to show photographic ID to vote at this year's local elections. The requirement for voter ID was introduced in the UK's Government Elections Act last year and we are now urging residents to make sure they are ready to vote in May by checking they have an accepted form of ID.

#### **ACCEPTED FORMS OF ID INCLUDE:**

- A passport (UK, European Economic Area, or Commonwealth)
- A drivers' licence (UK, European Economic Area, or Commonwealth)
- A concessionary travel pass, such as an older person's bus pass
- Milton Keynes All in One Card

Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo. A full list of accepted ID along with more information about the change can be found at electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID. Residents who do not have one of the accepted forms of ID can apply online for free ID called the 'Voter Authority Certificate' on a new website, which was launched on Monday 16 January, at: voterauthority-certificate.service.gov.uk/. Applicants will need to provide a photo and their full name, date of birth, National Insurance number, and the address at which they are registered to vote.

Registering to vote only takes five minutes at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Anyone unable to use the online form can request a paper version by calling Milton Keynes City Council on 01908 254706 or by emailing elections@milton-keynes.gov.uk (you will still need to be registered to vote beforehand but the City Council can help to register people unable to do this online themselves).

Postal voters will not be affected by the introduction of photo ID, and you will continue to receive your postal vote pack through the post.

If you choose to vote by proxy, where you appoint someone you trust to vote on your behalf, your proxy will need to take their own photo ID to be issued with a ballot paper. However, if you decide to cast your own vote, you will need to have photo ID with you when you go to the polling station.



#### What is an Annual Parish Meeting?

There is often confusion between the Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Parish Council Meeting. All Town and Parish Councils throughout England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting.

#### What is the purpose of the Annual Parish Meeting?

To give the Parish Council, and other local organisations an opportunity to let local residents know what they have been doing over the past year. The meeting is also an opportunity for electors to have a say on anything they consider valuable to the people of the Parish.

#### Will Parish Councillors be at the meeting?

All Parish Councillors will be invited to attend. Councillors will have an opportunity to raise questions and make comments if they wish. However, the purpose of the meeting is to enable the electors to find out what is going on in their parish and to have their say.

#### Will I be able to ask questions and make suggestions?

Any registered elector may ask a question of the Council which will usually be answered by the Chair, the Clerk or the Council.

An elector may also make a suggestion and comment on anything pertinent to the residents of the Parish.

This will be welcomed and is the whole purpose of the meeting!

# **Defibrillators**

Stantonbury Parish Council have recently installed a total of 4 life-saving Defibrillators across the Parish, the purchase of these defibrillators were enabled through jointly working with Milton Keynes City Council and a contribution from Developer S106 funds received as part of the development of Stantonbury Park.


As of the 25th January 2023, our defibrillators are fully live and registered on the National Defibrillator Network. Access is available via the Emergency Ambulance Service by calling 999 or 112. The locations for the defibrillators have been chosen by the councillors and to find the nearest one go to https://www.defibfinder.uk/ you will then be asked to enter your postcode.

We'd like to include a special mention to local resident John Evans who wrote to us with the original request for a defibrillator to be sited in Bancroft. This was then brought to the attention of the Council. Going forward our Parish Rangers will be monitoring and maintaining the defibrillators on a monthly basis.

IMPORTANT: In the event of an emergency dial 999 or 112 and ask for an ambulance before you do anything else. The operator will confirm the location of the nearest defibrillator and give you the number code to unlock the door of the defibrillator cabinet and access the equipment.

### **Motorbike Awareness**

Due to the increase of motorbikes and dirt bikes being used on the Redways parks and roads in Milton Keynes area including Bradville and Stantonbury . Thames Valley Police would like to make you aware of the consequences which could lead to fines and the bikes being confiscated when caught.

- If you ride on the pavement whether on a motorbike, moped or bicycle you are breaking the law. Under Section 72 of the Highway Act 1835, it states that it is an offence to ride a vehicle on the pavement and carries a £500 fine.
- Driving on a public road without a valid licence is considered to be an offence and you may be penalised for this. You may receive a penalty of three to six points on your licence, which will be endorsed on your official licence once you have acquired the correct one.
- You can only ride a motorcycle without a licence on private property with the owner's permission, or if you are part of a licenced motorcycles training program. This type of program is one where you are given your licence after you have successfully passed the course.

• What happens if you get caught riding a dirt bike on the road?

This could lead to prosecution and your bike being taken off you, along with your driving licence and a large fine. If you don't have a licence it could affect you getting one in the future. You may also commit other offences for causing harassment, alarm or distress under the Public Order Act 1994.

 What happens if you get caught riding a motorcycle without licence? This offence carries fines up to £1000,
 3-6 penalty points and discretionary disqualification from driving.

We don't have to tell you how dangerous this is to you and also innocent members of the public.




## **Janet Warren**

# **Parish Ranger Report**

We have been out clearing some of the overgrown pathways throughout the Parish. Below are just a couple of examples of what we have done on Bradville.





Fly tipping is an issue throughout the Parish. CCTV has been put up in hot spot areas to catch people that are fly tipping and the Enforcement Team then use the evidence captured to issue fines.

#### **Household Waste Recycling Centres**

You will need to book and can book on the day slots. You can

do this online at www.milton-keynes.gov.uk or by phone 01908 252811.

Please make sure that you are putting your household waste and recycling out (in the appropriate bags/bins), after 5pm either on the day before collection or by 7am on the day of collection. This will help with bags not being ripped open by wildlife. Please also make sure that all cardboard boxes are broken down and placed into a recycling bag.

You may have seen lots of spray-painted marks on the grass verges this due to the amount of dog fouling. Please clean up after your dog and place the bag in one of the bins provided or take it home and place it in your black bag.

Bulb planting has been done throughout the Parish and at the Community Hub.

Skip amnesties were held throughout the Parish on each estate and were a great success.

The Community Hub has now been decorated and had some electrical work done.



# Have you ever visited **Bancroft Roman Villa?**

Fields in Bancroft were excavated by archaeologists to reveal a Roman villa. The site is marked by stones so you can see what it would have looked like. If you take a photo of the floor plan on the information boards on site, you can work out what the rooms were used for including the Roman bath suite.

Originally a farm, by the stage this stone villa was built in 340 AD it was probably owned by a wealthy native Briton who had adopted the Roman way of life. The villa building was decorated with mosaics and frescos, many of which you will be able to see at Milton Keynes Museum when the new galleries open. In the meantime, you can see one of the mosaics at Centre:MK, conveniently situated outside the toilets!

The villa is situated in North Loughton Valley Park, Bancroft. You can walk or cycle to the site via the redways, or get there by car and park in The Parks Trust car park off Constantine Way. It's north of the concrete cows and south-east of Wolverton.

If you feel like a short loop walk, you can walk under the underpass to the site of the Roman mausoleum (burial chamber) that was found in Blue Bridge. Just off the redway, you can go onto the green and there is a stone pillar that marks the spot. Look out for the house nearby that was designed to represent the building (you can see what it is thought to have looked like on The Parks Trust website).

column.fairness.revived Nearby this site archaeologists found a late Bronze Age-Early Iron Age roundhouse - the biggest found in the UK with a diameter of just under 20 meters!


