Knife Amnesty in the Parish

TVP and Stantonbury Parish Council recently held an event in the parish for people to hand in weapons or unwanted knives anonymously. These events are known as knife amnesty or knife surrenders. The aim is to remove unwanted knives and other weapons from the street by providing bins or collection points where people can drop them off. This is done anonymously on a no questions asked basis.

Collection points are typically placed in easily accessible locations.

Here in Milton Keynes they can be located at: Milton Keynes Police Station Witan Gate Westcroft Centre, Wimbourne Crescent Frank Moran Centre Melrose Avenue West Bletchley

The majority of the time, knives are the most common item being dropped off in the bins or collection points but also collected in the past have been firearms real and imitation, CS canisters, knuckledusters, swords, crossbows etc.

The bins mentioned above are bolted to the floor with a letter box design meaning people cannot reach inside them and pull items out.

They are also ideal places to put any unwanted kitchen knives and garden bladed items in, knowing that the items will be disposed of correctly and kept off the streets.



When using these bins to dispose of knives or bladed articles please make sure that they are safely wrapped in newspaper or similar before putting in the bin.

Milton Keynes (Stony Stratford) Lions Club

Serves all the areas of North Milton Keynes

In 1925, Lions Clubs International promised Helen Keller to become 'Knights of the Blind'. This has led to the international adoption of the white stick as a symbol of the user's skills and talents, mobility and independence. It also allows the sighted person to recognize that the user is visually impaired. Today, across the world Lions are working towards the day when no one should suffer unnecessarily from vision problems. Through eye centres and hospitals, medicines and surgeries, eye glasses and eye banks, Lions are working to end preventable blindness and aid the visually impaired.

How can YOU help? Have you any spectacles you no longer use?

In 1967 Chichester Lions Club began collecting old glasses for recycling. The initiative really took off in 1980 with a delivery of 700 sorted specs to the Missionary Optical Society (MOS) in Devon for use in their clinics in Kenya and India. Gradually other Lions Clubs started feeding their recycled spectacles through Chichester. So in 1985, a link was established with Le Havre Lions and Medico France. Over the following five years some 100,000 specs, 43,000 lenses, and 10,000 frames were sent to Medico France while still delivering to MOS in Devon as many pairs of sorted specs as needed.

In the first half of 1990, a national campaign with Boots the

Chemist and Help The Aged produced 460,000 pairs of specs in six months. Once sorted they went to places such as Cameroon, Senegal, Ivory Coast, Sri Lanka, India, Zanzibar, Jamaica, Bolivia, and Brazil.

Spectacle donations arrive in Chichester in boxes and bags of all shapes and sizes. They are expertly sorted by Lions members and volunteers. Those sent onto Medico France are then cleaned and graded for use in eye camps in Africa, India, and Eastern Europe.



Every year over 300,000 pairs of spectacles are sent to Medico France. Indeed, donations by UK Lions Clubs, recycled through Chichester, account for more than half of the total number of spectacles processed by Medico France. Your local Lions Club send over 500 pairs of spectacles every month which they collect from local opticians including Stony Optical in Cofferidge Close, Stony Stratford.

FRAUD



Becoming a victim of fraud can be both frightening and overwhelming. It can leave you with worries about money and also the feeling of loss of identity. Not knowing which way to turn to ask for help.

Please remember it is never your fault if you have been a victim of fraud. You are not to blame and there is no shame.

PERSONAL INFORMATION

Criminals will try to get hold of personal information as this makes it possible for them to take out financial products like loans and credit cards.

- Treat personal information like your house or car keys. NEVER hand it over to strangers.
- Always be mindful about what personal information you share online.
- Only give out personal information after careful consideration.

SAFEGUARD YOUR FINANCES

Criminals will try different tactics to get to your finances. Warning signs include:

- Asking you to withdraw money or transfer to different accounts.
- Asking for your password or PIN. NEVER give this out.
- Asking you to purchase expensive items such as jewellery etc
- Asking for cash to check fingerprints.

CRIMINALS WILL USE THE TELEPHONE

- Threatening to have you arrested if you do not do something such as withdraw cash or transfer money.
- Recorded Message stating you have won a prize.
- Family member in trouble e.g., lost their phone when abroad.

CONTACT VIA EMAIL AND WEBSITES

This means that an email address can be made to look like it's from a genuine organisation. Just because it looks genuine does not mean that it is.

- Check that there is a closed padlock icon in the browsers address bar when paying online for items.
- Always take extra steps to be certain before proceeding and never provide copies of photographs or documents to a stranger online to a response to a request out of the blue.

CONTACT VIA DOORSTEP AT HOME ADDRESS

You may get doorstep callers offering services or products for sale. This can include people posing as bank officials or couriers.

- You are asked or pressured into handing over money at the door.
- You are asked or pressured to hand over bank cards or taken to a bank to withdraw money.
- Asked to let them have your PIN no.

These are just a few of the ways that criminals will try to get your money. They are becoming more and more clever in the way that they will try to make you hand over your money. If you feel something is wrong and does not feel right then STOP and say NO. Research that company or person before handing over money.

Computers for Local Schools and Charities

In our Spring 2022 edition of our Newsletter, we brought you news of how we contacted a local company Motor Insurance Bureau (MIB) and together were able to provide over 70 reconditioned laptops to educational institutions.

Well, I'm pleased to say we have joined forces again. This time we have been able to offer brand new desk top computers, including a monitor to local schools and charities in the area.

During the weeks of June we were able to safely deliver them to their grateful recipients, which included Squirrels Childrens Centre, Wood End School and Stantonbury International School, along with local charities The Night Shelter and Age UK:MK. All of whom join us in saying a huge THANK YOU, once again to the staff of MIB without whose generosity and time this would not have been possible.





Redway Code

To 'outsiders' Milton Keynes is made up of Roundabouts and concrete cows but we know much better about our lovely parks and the Redways which connect them.

In order to enjoy the Redways safely there are some simple rules

RESPECT OTHER PEOPLE

- Be polite and courteous. Consider the needs of others.
- Wherever possible, cycle on the left, walk on the right.
 Don't change direction suddenly and signal clearly while cycling.
- Take care when passing other people, slow down, allow plenty of room and use a polite audible method to signal your approach.
- Slow down at bends and all junctions and be prepared to stop when necessary.
- Only walk or cycle two abreast. Don't obstruct the Redway or stand in groups; allow others to pass quickly and easily.
- Don't use your mobile phone. It's safer to be aware of your surroundings especially of people approaching from behind.
- If you need to cross a redway in a vehicle e.g. to reach a private driveway, drivers should give way to pedestrians and cyclists. (Highway Code rule 206)
- Take your litter home.

- Keep dogs under control, preferably on a short lead.
- Always clean up after your dog and get rid of mess responsibly.
- Report problems on the redways glass, potholes, lighting and vegetation to MK Highways.

REDWAYS AND THE LAW

Electric cycles which meet the EAPC Regulations 2015 are permitted to use Redways.

As Public Highway, all legal requirements and the Highway Code are applicable to the Redways: cycles should be road worthy and able to stop in an emergency; cycle lights are required at night. (H.C. Rules for cyclists 59-82)

All motor-powered vehicles including mopeds, mini-motos and motorcycles are prohibited from using Redways with the exception of authorised vehicles e.g. emergency vehicles and maintenance vehicles.

Away from the Redways; pavements and footways are for pedestrians only. Cycling on the pavement is an offence which carries a fine of £500.



Exploring the parks on your doorstep: Linford Wood

Linford Wood is a great place to escape and unwind all year round. Carpeted with bluebells, wood anemones and primroses in Spring, by Summer the trees are in leaf and you can fully appreciate the beauty of the ancient woodland. Autumn is the best time for colour and to spot funghi, and Winter is great for crunching through frozen leaves and is easiest for spotting woodland birds in the bare trees.

There are a series of surfaced footpaths so the wood is accessible throughout the year and The Parks Trust cuts the vegetation above the paths so the light makes these routes feel more open.

In terms of activities, there are a few spots with picnic benches and you could challenge children (or adults!) to identify the remnants of the old sculpture trail, including animals carved into tree stumps. Most of the original sculptures have rotted and disappeared over the years, but The Parks Trust is in discussions to try and bring some back in the future. If you fancy a bit of forest bathing, Love Exploring have created a forest bathing walk on their free

App. The Parks Trust also has lots of resources online for you to explore, including a Tree ID guide and activities for youngsters. We also run guided walks around the wood. Just visit www.theparkstrust.com to find out more.

Deer, badgers and foxes are among the creatures you may catch sight of if you visit at a quiet time of day, but Linford Wood is especially noteworthy for its bird and insect life in the open rides. Look out for the Green Woodpecker, Greater Spotted Woodpecker, Tree Creeper, Willow Warbler and the Sparrowhawk and Tawny Owl. Come out early on a Spring morning to hear the fantastic dawn chorus.

As you explore the wood, please stick to the main paths. Linford Wood has been woodland for at least 700 years and is one of our rare habitats, providing homes for a huge range of wildlife. Sadly, ancient woodlands only make up 2.5% of the UK and it is therefore vital that we help protect these fragile ecosystems.

Please can we remind all dog walkers to keep their pets on leads in the woods during breeding season (March to September).

Chaucer and his pilgrims visit Bradwell Abbey for Maundy Thursday!



With help from Stantonbury Parish Council in the form of a grant, Bradwell Abbey was paid a timeslip visit by Geoffrey Chaucer and his Canterbury Pilgrims on Thursday 6th April!

Celebrating their re-imagined Pilgrim Trail, City Discovery Centre at Bradwell Abbey opened their fourteenth-century pilgrimage chapel and welcomed their medieval visitors alongside many modern Milton Keynesians!

Starting with a guided tour of the newly-conserved chapel,

the modern and medieval pilgrims walked side by side, sharing tales and trails over to St Lawrence's Church in Bradwell, currently celebrating its 800th anniversary.

Elsewhere on site, eager Easter bunnies hunted for eggs on the Annual Bradwell Abbey Easter Hunt, while their families enjoyed snacks from the Good Time Café, and busied themselves making Easter crafts. There were some excellent Easter bonnets on display!
